
Wanting to experiment with a new medium, I decided to create a plaster mold of my grandpa's arm. This art piece depicts his hard working farmer hands with harvested wheat.

Easton Bowring is an outstanding young service leader in his local and global community. For the past three years Easton has been a student leader in the Youthlinc Service Year, which is a structured school-year long curriculum where students are required to contribute 80 hours of service in their own community, while also attending monthly team meetings in preparation to serve internationally in Guatemala, Peru, Cambodia, Thailand, Nepal, Kenya, or Madagascar.

In 2015, as a Youthlinc Service Year student, Easton went above and beyond by contributing 109 hours of service, 51 of which were at the Monticello High School Special Education Department where he assisted in learning activities for peers with disabilities. Halfway through the school year, his teacher unexpectedly sent me an email expressing gratitude for Easton's dedicated service.

That summer, Easton spent a minimum of 60 hours directly serving the villagers in Santa Isabel, Peru. He was instrumental on the Education Committee where he prepared and taught interactive English lessons. During one lesson, Easton taught the children about words related to an Antarctic animal, the penguin. He connected with the children in such a way that they nicknamed Easton "el pingüino" forever more. Easton not only serves others, but he connects with others as well. He loves them and they love him back.

In 2016, Easton returned to Santa Isabel, Peru as an Alum Leader where he mentored 5 students on the Cultural Committee. He guided his committee as they prepared activities to help the team make meaningful connections with the villagers through art, music, dance, soccer, games, and home visits. Under his leadership, his committee raised over \$1,200 for cultural exchange activities by making and selling chocolate-covered strawberries.

Easton now serves as the Kenya Assistant Team Leader where he inspires and mentors 25 students as they each contribute 80 hours of community service resulting in 2,000+ service hours in Utah. He takes ownership of his responsibilities and goes above and beyond to accomplish goals. He isn't afraid to ask questions. He thinks of creative solutions to problems. He is organized and detail-oriented.

As the Youthlinc Local Service Director, each year I oversee 300+ students as they engage in local and international service. Easton ranks in the top 1% of students for his burning desire to serve others combined with his interpersonal and leadership skills. An investment in Easton is an investment in social good because he is a young humanitarian who will continue to make service a priority in throughout his life.






Model United Nations




Utah Food Bank

My position provides me with many opportunities to interact and work with the youth in our community. From that experience, I can say Easton is an exception amongst his peers in skill, performance, and motivation.

In the past two years of working for the city, Easton has profoundly impacted the community for the better. He is a creative thinker and problem solver. Easton approaches his work objectively, and can take concepts and turn them into a great product. He analyzes and reviews the expectations, outlines the necessary steps, develops concepts thoughtfully, and is creative through the process' entirety. We are a small city and a lot is expected of all our employees, full-time and seasonal. In his first-year Easton worked above and beyond in his position from his involvement in planning a new city triathlon to the annual fast pitch tournament, the city's sporting event of the year. We found him to be a great resource in creative content for marketing events and designing logos. He has a great eye for creative detail, and was able capture the planned idea and vision for the community.

In Easton's first season, we were reviewing the tasks ahead for the annual fast pitch tournament. In reviewing the budget one of the spending cut backs that I was anticipating was the cost of promotional material (i.e. t-shirts, winner plaques, logos, etc). Easton came to me with the idea to use the school's wood shop for the plaques, and offered to design the logo himself. Not only did he come with an idea he also brought a plan of action to the table—who to contact, the timeline they would need to complete the plaques, and what design he himself could complete on his city time rather than us contracting out to a graphic designer. The design he created that first year was clean, unique, and favorite of the tournament. Additionally, through his resourceful thinking we could make our budget goals for the event. Easton has continued to be a great resource in creatively thinking how the city can reach out to other parts of the community.

Another reason I hired Easton was due to his dedication towards attaining his goals. He understands the importance of hard work and sacrifice. Easton was timely in all our expectations of him whether it was completing a project deadline or his arrival to an event. He was proactive in his schedule, if he had conflicts in his schedule he worked hard to have tasks completed ahead of time or search for effective replacements. In my position, I have a variety of responsibilities which prevent me from daily monitoring of our staff. Most often I will introduce a task to my staff and leave them to it while I attend to other matters. Due to Easton's trustworthiness and work ethic, I quickly found that he was an individual I could always depend on. When left to his own devices he will work hard and do the job right.

Easton is also a great leader. In his second season of working for me and using him as my assistant I found him to be very professional in all his encounters. He was asked to do things that pushed him outside of his comfort zone. but he was willing, coachable and thus excelled. When Easton was asked to assist in summer staff projects such as cleanups and building reorganization he always rose to the lead in working with other part-timers. More importantly he was seamlessly able to lead the group based on expectations I had previously laid out.

Easton is greatly respected in the community and at the city offices by both his peers, adults, and other city employees. The growth of his knowledge and talents are apparently important to him in his dedication to his work, school, and community service. He will continue to find success in his schooling and future endeavors. Easton will be a great asset to the University he chooses to attend, and community he becomes a part of. 


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History Fair






